GREENSBORO — Some 40 representatives from 10 colleges and universities in North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia gathered at Bennett College last week for a three-day Long Range Planning Seminar sponsored by the Fund for the Advancement of Education of the Ford Foundation. College presidents, deans, busi-

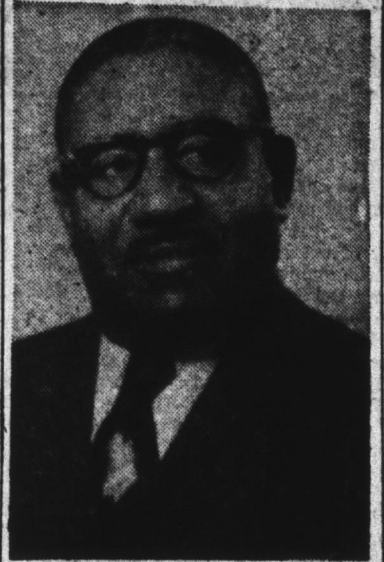
ness managers and trustees were engaged in working out 10-year budgets and enrollment projections. Each college was asked to submit its own projects in advance and these formed the basis for work in general and small-group sessions.

Among the institutions represented, in addition to the host college, were Benedict College, Columbia, S. C.; Elon College, Guilford College, Hampton (Va.) Institute, Livingstone College, Queens College, St. Augustine's College, St. Paul's College, Lawrenceville, Va., and Virginia Union University, Richmond, Va.

Delegates, who were housed at the Holiday Inn, registered in the David D. Jones Student Union, and immediately following were guests at dinner at which time they were welcomed by President Fayer and heard a lecture, via telephone from New York City by Sidney G. Tickton, program associate for the fund. His subject was "The Need for Planning at Private Colleges and Universities." A discussion followed.

Invalidate Hotel Segregation
NEW ORLEANS — Ruling in a case brought by James McCain, CORE organization director, a special three judge district court unanimously invalidated a state law enforcing segregation in hotels. Judge John M. Wisdom and Judge Herbert Christenberry said the decision "dooms the long-standing state wide custom that white hotels may not accept Negro guests."
McCain initiated the case after being refused a room at the Hotel Orleans last November. CORE has planned nonviolent action on a major scale if the hotels continue to discriminate when the American Legion holds its convention here in July.
McCain's case was handled by Lolis Elie, CORE attorney and by Jack Nelson and Ben Smith, attorneys for the American Civil Liberties Union.

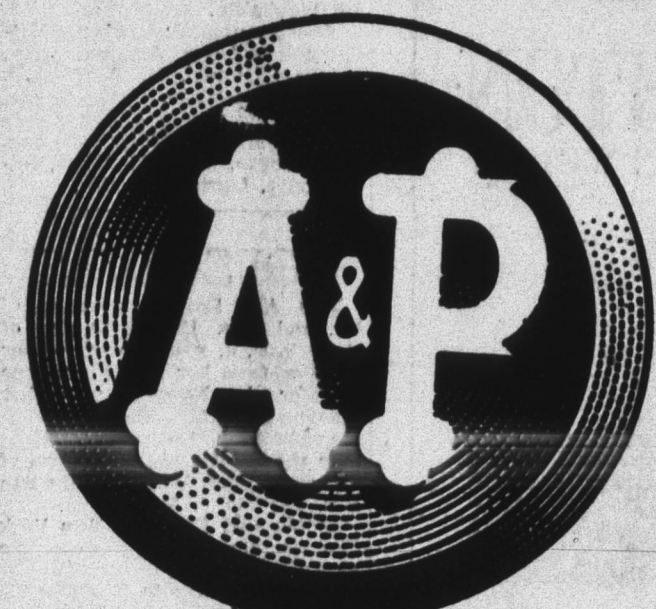
