

### Bishop Walls, AMEZ Prelate, Announces Huge Demonstration

NEW YORK CITY — Bishop W. J. Walls, senior prelate of the AME Zion Church, announced this week that the biggest demonstration for freedom will take place here Sept. 9-13.

More than 750,000 members of the AME Zion Church have been called to action and a large segment of this number will take part in commemoration of 167 years of "Freedom Marching" on the part of the denomination.

The prelate sets out that Mother AME Zion Church, 136th Street, is the "Cradle of Negro Freedom." He says this augurs well with the fight now being carried on by Negroes to complete the job started by the founding fathers.

He lists the names of James Varick, Frederick Douglass, Sojourner Truth, William Wells Brown, Ann Eliza Gardner, J. W. Lougen, Bishop, J. W. Hood and Alexander

Walters, along with Dr. J. C. Price, as proponents of freedom unexcelled by any.

## 'Keep Cash Drawer Locked,' Credit Union Workers Told

**GREENSBORO** — "Keep the cash drawer locked," was the sound advice given last week at the annual Credit Union Workshop held at A&T College. Giving the advice was Dargan Frierson, resident agent for the Federal Bureau of Investigation at Greensboro. He was delivering a main address on last Friday before visiting credit union workers and officials from throughout North Carolina.

Taking as his subject, "Security Controls," he told the group that there are many deterrents which can and should be used to discourage theft and embezzlement, but, by far, the best method is to keep cash always under lock and key. He said careless handling of funds is the cause and encouragement for most thefts.

On the day before, James J. Lichty, Madison, Wisconsin, Education Department, Credit Union National Association, said in his keynote address, "The Credit Union
