Fraternal Leader Is Family Man

WINSTON-SALEM — Thomas Foy Poag, 62, of 1124 N. Highland Avenue, this city, was elected Imperial Potentate (National President) of the nation's 20,000 Negro Shriners on Friday, August 23, in Pittsburgh, Pa., scene of the annual convention. He succeeded Attorney Genoa S. Washington of Chicago, Ill.

Mr. Poag is a teacher of mathematics and biology at Ashland High School here. He earned the B. A. degree at Lincoln University in Pennsylvania; received the M. S. degree at the University of Pennsylvania, State College, Pa., and did post-graduate work at A&T College, Greensboro.

The new Imperial Potentate is married to the former Miss Mollie A. Allen. They have one child, Mrs. Elizabeth Anderson, who is employed by the Urban Redevelopment Project in Atlanta, Ga.

Mr. Poag, who ascended to the top post from that of Deputy Imperial Potentate, has also served in the imperial cabinet as Chief Rabbi and national adviser to the Daughters of Isis, auxiliary group.

He was also the first Illustrious Potentate of Sethos Temple No. 170, here; Past Master of Salem Lodge, No. 139 and Commander-in-Chief of King Solomon Consistory No. 64. He is a member of the Phi Beta

Capital City Represented In 'March'

As CAROLINIAN press time neared, the crowds in Washington, D. C., had already passed the 200,000 mark and demonstrators were continually coming in from all over the United States and some foreign countries.

The march was termed "American history's most massive and peaceful demonstration for Negro rights" by United Press International.

The weather in Washington was described as ideal.

They came singing, chanting, and on occasion, praying. There were religious leaders, union leaders, entertainers, and scores of thousands of ordinary citizens.

Sex Assault Charged By Woman Here

Mrs. Margaret Sarvis, 19-year-old Raleigh housewife, of 1420 Scales Street, told police officers early Tuesday that she was sexually assaulted by a Negro intruder, who allegedly broke into her home about 3 a. m. and threatened her life.

The woman further claimed she was blindfolded, her mouth gagged and was forced to accompany her attacker some distance from her home to a railroad track where she said the attack took place.

Police reports show that Mrs. Sarvis stated she heard a noise in the back yard of her home about 2:45 a. m. and a few minutes later heard a noise in her kitchen.

The woman said that she got out of her bed and found a man sitting at her kitchen table. She
