

St. Aug.'s Dean Shaw Orator:

"Individual Responsibility, Rights Revolution," Dr. Robinson's Subject

"Individual Responsibility and the American Revolution for Rights" was the subject of Dr. Presell Robinson's address at Shaw University on Friday, January 10. "These are new occasions today which imply new duties and responsibilities. In this era of automation, the old ways of doing things are out-moded, he stated.

Dr. Robinson said, "suggests freedom riders, demonstrations, boycotts, and sit-ins. The constitution of the United States represents the sum and substance of man's fight for liberty through a period of centuries long.

The United States, he stated, "has nearly 200,000,000 citizens of African descent—Negroes, the largest population on earth outside of Africa. The goodwill toward this country which exists in Ireland, Poland, England, and Israel, grows in part, out of ethnic identity between people in those countries and


our own. Potentially, America has enormous advantage over the rest of the world in its relation to African states, if we could send them a large number of qualified American technicians of American descent. But this advantage is largely potential, due to our failure to give our Negro citizens a fair share economically and educationally."

Dr. Robinson pointed out that the Negro population of the United States in 1950 was roughly 10 percent of the total. "If Negroes had been trained in professional and technical categories in relation to their total population, there would be, approximately 33,000 Negro auditors and accountants, not 960; 1,400 airplane pilots and navigators, not 60; 2,200 architects, not 180; 52,000 technical engineers, not 1,620; 16,000 doctors.

"Communism led by Russia and Democracy by the U.S.A. are desperately striving to win minds of

the millions throughout the world who have not yet decided their way of life," he said.

In conclusion Dr. Robinson urged the students to prepare themselves for new job opportunities by learning to speak their mother tongue with fluency, learning to do the very best job possible in whatever they do, cultivating the habit of good manners, remembering their responsibility of voting; and to see that their children are brought up in the Judea-Christian tradition, and exposed to a good education.

The selections were announced Monday in Look Magazine.

Higginbotham, who won this honor from a field of 200 top candidates, "was 34 when President Kennedy nominated him for the Federal Trade Commission," Look said. "He became the youngest man ever appointed to that body and the first Negro commissioner of a
