% cup (small can) undiluted Carnation Evaporated Milk

Combine evaporated mifk, sugar, butter and salt in saucepan over medium heat. Bring to a boil, and cook 5 minutes, stirring constantly. (Start timing when mixture starts to "bubble" around edges of pan). Remove from heat. Stir in marshmallows, chocolate, vanilla and raisins. Stir vigorously for 1 minute or until marshmallows are completely melted and blended. Spread chopped nuts on heavy waxed paper. Pour fudge mixture over nuts. As fudge cools, form into roll. Cut in ½ inch slices.


