### Hold Mom In Starvation Death Of Boy

NORFOLK, Va. (AP) — A 34-year-old mother of eight was arrested last week and charged with the murder by starvation of her five-month-old son.

The accused woman is Mrs. Dorothy Barnes, who was scheduled to appear in Police Court on the murder charge.

The child, found dead in his mother's bed, weighed 6 pounds, 3 ounces when he was born at Norfolk Community Hospital Sept. 15, 1963, and 5 pounds, 8 ounces at death.

The state medical examiner's office said an autopsy showed the death was caused by starvation.

### Negro History Week Observed At Shaw Univ.

Negro History Week was observed at Shaw University with students participating as speakers February 10-14. William Parker spoke on the topic "The misconception of Lincoln and the Emancipation Proclamation" Monday, Feb. 10, and Charles Humphrey Mubua and Frederick Ouka spoke on "Africa's Politics" Friday, Feb. 14.

High points of the discussion on Africa were that so little is known about East African States that many people confuse issues by judging one African country through the information of events happening to another African country, not knowing these countries can be so different, and each is faced with its own unique problems.

Also in the period of decolonization, Africans are evolving their own political ideology to meet several needs. In most of Africa, the African businessmen associate capitalism with the worst colonialism. It was noted that African Socialism is a part of the African tradition and provides most individuals in Africa with a certain amount of security.

### Spring Hope Native Named By Peace Corps

LOME, Togo—Clotha Payne Lucas has been named Peace Corps Deputy Representative for Togo, it was announced officially in Washington. He was formerly field officer for the medical, fishing and educational project here. His higher responsibilities begin immediately.

Lucas, a graduate of Maryland State College, at Princess Anne, operated the Republic's Peace Corps program since for even a secretary.

Born in Spring Hope, Lucas earned his master's degree at American University, and has completed academic requirements for the Ph.D. at the same school.

The 30-year-old bachelor was a rampaging guard on "Skip" McCane's 1951-52 hard driving Maryland State Hawks football team.

"I find the Togoese the most friendly people I have ever met," he said. "Once you treat the African people with dignity and respect, they will like and appreciate you. They will show this appreciation by offering gifts that often they cannot afford."

Lucas said he has been pleased with his assignment because of the quality of Peace Corps Volunteers "I've been extremely impressed with them. Our most difficult task," he added, "is to show how well Americans can get along. Then another Birmingham, Cambridge or a similar distasteful incident pops up and almost destroys everything we have built up."

About the Peace Corps, Lucas said, "I feel this is the most valuable and dynamic program I have ever had the privilege of being associated with."

"Not only are we taking much to the African people, but we are learning a heck of a lot ourselves," Lucas declared.

He said he had heard much about "cultural shock." "About the only shock I have experienced came while I was home. I wasn't accustomed to all the luxuries and conveniences."

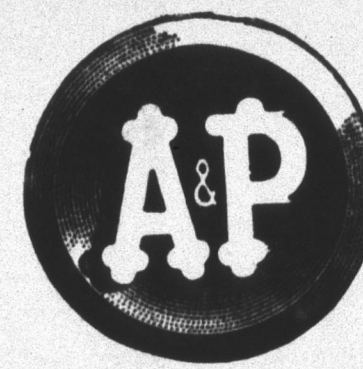
