Thomas F. Poag Calls For Increased Gov't Concern

ST. LOUIS, Mo.—Thomas F. Poag, the Imperial Potentate of the Prince Hall Shriners, called for increased federal government concern in education. He said that the government must act now to see that a balanced educational program is provided for all citizens.

The Prince Hall Shrine leader, who is an educator in Winston-Salem, N. C., issued the challenge during a press conference in the Statler-Hilton Hotel where a delegation of the Order was meeting to finalize many phases of the organization's sixty-third national convention meeting in Kiel Auditorium, August 16 through 21, 1964.

Citing the need for increased federal government support Mr. Poag said: "We cannot afford at this late period in our national history to continue to waste human resources as a result of poor educational backgrounds, regardless of race, creed or national origin."

"There is a need now for additional leadership, research, advice and direction in education," he

pointed out. "National guidance and direction is sorely needed to promote desirable educational opportunities for the nation's increasing mobile population and especially its minorities."

Pointing out that Prince Hall Shriners are concerned about the education of all the people, Mr. Poag added that "the desiring of a free country rests upon how well we provide the right public schools with a superior brand of education for all the people."

Urging Shriners to conduct an intensive voter registration campaign the Shrine leader, who headed the organization's Voter-Registration Project since 1956, said that many of the problems of the nation were tied up in the failure of thousands of Americans to participate in government. He set May 17 a target date for culmination of the massive effort on the part of the nation's more than 25,000 Prince Hall Shriners. He called this a historic and memorable date just ten years after the now famous Supreme Court's School Decision.
