## President Willa B. Player Gives Senior Day Address

GREENSBORO—The new opportunities which are opening to you today, require more effort than you anticipate and this calls for ever heightening aspirations," President Willa B. Player declared in her Senior Day address at Bennett College Friday.

Dr. Player's address followed Dr. Chauncey G. Winston's presentation of the class for their caps and gowns, which members of the sophomore class helped their senior sisters to do.

He also announced that of this date Miss Linda Powell, of

Goldsboro, a history major, with an average of 3.84 of a possible 3.0, is leading the class academically, followed by Miss Lilla Alphonse, of Panama, a Spanish major, with a 2.89 average.

Using as her topic, "The Need for Heightening Aspirations," Dr. Player told the seniors that their academic attire was not only symbolic of achievement, but inspirational for underclasswomen.

"The college," she said, "has done all that it can to help you to aspire. It has sought to

whet your appetite and to raise your sights. We hope that we have provided enough selective content to help you discover yourself and to relate yourself to others. We have sought to help you to develop a sense of values."

Pointing out that there is a tendency today for some persons to look upon an easy life after many years of struggle, and, therefore, to have low levels of aspiration, Dr. Player warned against "deceptive ease." She urged obedience to self, to truth and to responsibility.

"Your chief resource," she stated, "is the individual's desire to achieve a meaningful and purposeful life. Supported by what you have learned, dreaming of what you would become an driven by a passionate desire to serve, reach ever upward, beginning with the heart."
