Highlighting the afternoon session will be "Meat Cooking School Lunch Style," by Mrs. Hattie McSwain, Home Economist with the National Live-Stock and Meat Board, Chicago, Illinois.

This will be followed by the presentation of awards and prizes. Mrs. Ernestine Freeman is chairman of local arrangements.
