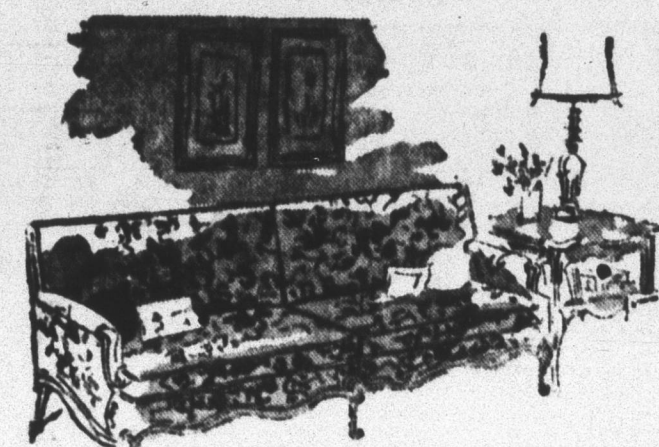
ZETA ZEST

National Staff Member To Preach At Davie St. Presbyterian Sunday

Davie Street United Presbyterian Church will be honored on Sunday, April 26, at the 11:00 A. M. service when the Reverend Jack M. MacLeod, secretary of Information Services, Board of Christian Education of the United Presbyterian Church U.S.A., will preach.

Previously, Rev. MacLeod was a secretary in adult program in the Board's Division of Lay Education, General Division of Parish Education.

Before his election to the Board of Christian Education, he was pastor of First Presbyterian Church, Bend, Oregon. Mr. MacLeod, a native of Pasadena, California, holds an A. B. degree from United College and a B. D. degree from San Francisco Theological Seminary. He also studied at Princeton Theological Seminary.

He is author of two dramas, "Eyes to See" and "The Horse Smeared," and a Westminster Press book, "Their Is The Kingdom."

The Rev. J. Oscar McCloud, local pastor, states that this is the first time to his knowledge that a member of the Church's national staff has preached in the local church.

The Reverend Jack MacLeod will be in Raleigh for an area General Mission Interpretation Conference to be held at the local church on Sunday at 4 p. m.
