STAY IN SCHOOL KIDS ROCKY MOUNT — Have just listened to a State College expert in Raleigh, telling how much more you kids will benefit if you will REMAIN IN SCHOOL AND GRADUATE FROM 12 GRADES instead of just four or five grades. A 1952 FIFTH Grade survey has shown, the official said, that FORTY-EIGHT (48) percent of the 5th graders failed to finish the high school courses. A similar survey of the Fifth Graders of record for the year 1953 has indicated a ONE percent INCREASE in graduates with only FORTY-SEVEN (47) failing to complete the Twelfth Grade.

The Vets Corner

Here are authoritative answers by the Veterans Administration to questions from former servicemen and their families: Q—Several years ago I received a widow's pension under the "old law." Later, I started to work and my income exceeded the limitations allowed. I plan to retire soon and will reapply for benefits. Will I still be entitled to them under the "old law"? A—If you were receiving the pension on or before July 1, 1960, and are otherwise eligible, you will resume payments under the "old law" automatically, unless you elect the current pension system.
