"WORLD OF ELEANOR ROOSEVELT" TV SPECIAL HOLLYWOOD (ANP)—The World of Eleanor Roosevelt TV special aired May 3, over KTTY, Channel II and hosted by Gregory Peck, written by Dore Schary and Produced by Himan Brown for the Eleanor Roosevelt Memorial Foundation, featured songs by Marian Anderson and Harry Belafonte on the star-studded program.

Others participating in the tribute for the late wife of President Franklin Delano Roosevelt included the Hon. Adlai Stevenson, Paul Newman and Joan Woodard. Edward G. Robinson, Celeste Holm, Ralph Bellamy, Agnes Moorehead and Isaac Stern.

The presentation also featured such other famous personalities as Harry Belafonte, singing "Sister Suki" and "God Bless a Child; Edward G. Robinson, showing photographs of the important moments in the life of Mrs. Roosevelt; Paul Newman and Joan Woodard, reading favorite poems and Bible passages of Mrs. Roosevelt's column.

On April 23, 1963, President Kennedy signed the Congressional Act chartering the Foundation.
