## Solve a Crime

**YOU ARE THE DETECTIVE**

A gang of four vicious hoodlums has been having a "big time" in your town for a number of weeks—robbing, burglarizing, mugging, and wantonly maiming some of its victims. To top off these depredations, one of the police detectives on their trail, Jim Davis, was shot to death several days ago by one of the gang.
