A&T's 410 Grads Hear Central State's President

GREENSBORO—A&T College graduates were told last week that power is not diplomas, certificates and degrees. "But power comes from that which they represent."

Speaking was Dr. Charles H. Wesley, president of Central State College, Wilberforce, Ohio. He was delivering the main address at the 73rd annual A&T commencement exercises. The event was held at the Greensboro Coliseum on Saturday, May 30.

Among the 410 graduates to receive degrees from A&T President, Dr. Lewis C. Dowdy, was John Lee Steinhauser, Wilkes-Barre, Pa., the first white person to receive a diploma from the previously all-Negro institution.

Steinhauser, a teacher at the Wilkes-Barre Memorial High School, was awarded the master of science degree in education, with concentration in chemistry.

Halleck L. Donelson, Newport, Oregon, another white man, earned the same degree, but was not present at the commencement exercises.

Barber-Scotia Given 174 G's For Building

CONCORD—President L. S. Cozart announced at the commencement exercises on Monday that Barber-Scotia College had received the sum of \$174,000 as its share in the first distribution of the funds collected from the United Negro College Fund Capital Funds Campaign. The president announced that this money would be used for the building program now in progress.

At this program, Dr. John Hope Franklin, the commencement speaker, admonished the graduates to pursue the truth wherever it may lead. He said to them that they had been trained to analyze facts and to determine that which is true, and that they should pursue truth relentlessly and courageously which is a mark of character.

At the baccalaureate exercise on Sunday, Dr. J. Ernest Somerville told the graduates that they should prepare their minds and wills to take certain calculated risks in life. That they should be wise in the choice of the risks they take, or that life cannot be truly lived without risks being taken.

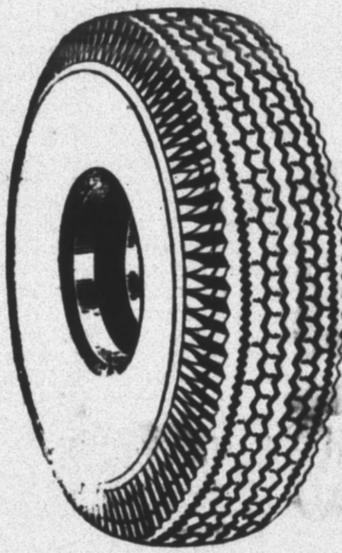
K. C. Given Over 214 G's For Project

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. — Knoxville College has received \$214,480 from the United Negro College Fund, to be used for the Student Union Building, now under construction, according to Dr. James A. Coston, president of the college.

Dr. Coston reported that the money was part of \$7,000,000 distributed recently to the 23-member colleges of UNCF. A total of \$30,000,000 is the goal of UNCF's development campaign, to be distributed to the 23 institutions over a three-year period.

"UNCF grants may be used for construction of new buildings, improvement of present buildings, and equipment necessary for new or improved facilities," Dr. Coston said.

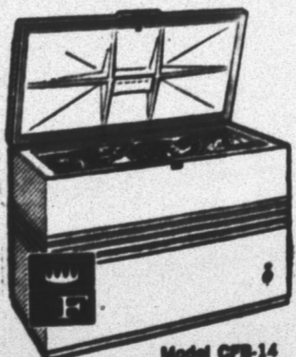

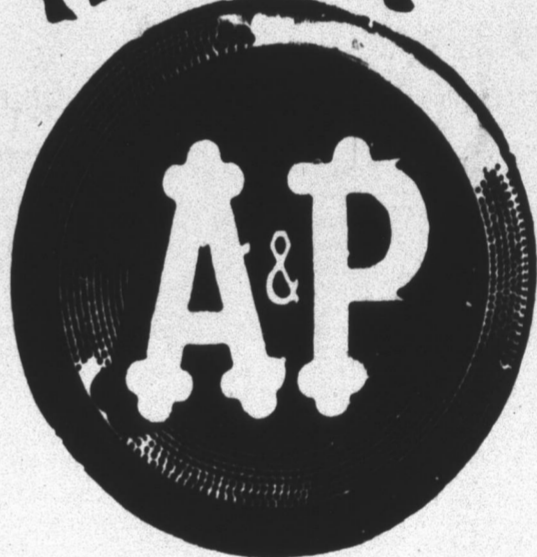
