VSC Receives **Atomic Energy Research Grant**

PETTERSBURG, Va.-The Atom ic Energy Commission has awarded Virginia State College a \$10,000 grant to be used by the Department of Agronomy for laboratory studies and instruction using nineteen radioisotopes, Russell S. Poor, AEC Director of Education and Training, announced today.

A license, previously issued, pro-vides that the radioactive material must be used by or under the direct supervision of Dr. C. C. Lewis.

Dr. Lewis, professor of ag-ronomy in the School of Agriculture, states that the materials will be used to serve the sciences, and in instruction be-ginning in September. The nineteen radioisotopes will also be used in research in agronomy and a course in nuclear science and technology.
