SUFFOLK, VIRGINIA — A high school drop-out who left home "to help his mother" is currently attending a Summer Institute for Secondary Teacher of Mathematics at Southwestern State College, Durant, Okla., working toward a master's degree.

Walter "Lane" Parker, son of Mrs. Willie Mary Parker of 422 Culloden Street, Suffolk, Va., left Booker Washington High School one year prior to graduation, but went on to complete his education in the U. S. Air Force and to prepare for a career as one of Virginia's most promising young coaches.

A 1957 graduate of A & T College in Greensboro, Parker has been teaching at his high school alma mater since September, 1956. He formerly taught high school in Blacksville, S.C. Parker also doubles as football coach for the Booker Bears and also serves as assistant basketball coach.

VSC Receives Atomic Energy Research Grant

PETERSBURG, Va.—The Atomic Energy Commission has awarded Virginia State College a \$10,000 grant to be used by the Department of Agronomy for laboratory studies and instruction using nineteen radiotopes, Russell S. Poor, AEC Director of Education and Training, announced today.

A license, previously issued, provides that the radioactive material must be used by or under the direct supervision of Dr. C. C. Lewis.

Dr. Lewis, professor of agronomy in the School of Agriculture, states that the materials will be used to serve the sciences, and in instruction beginning in September. The nineteen radiotopes will also be used in research in agronomy and a course in nuclear science and technology.

Dr. Emmett J. Rice Named Deputy Director Treasury's Office In D. C.

WASHINGTON, D. C.—Secretary of the Treasury Douglas Dillon Thursday announced the appointment of Dr. Emmett J. Rice of New York as Deputy Director of the Treasury Department's Office of Developing Nations. Dr. Rice will replace Dr. Samuel Z. Westerfield who has become Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for African Affairs.

In his new position, Dr. Rice will aid Secretary Dillon and Assistant Secretary John C. Bullitt in the formulation of U. S. financial policies affecting the developing Nations of the middle east, Africa, and Asia. The position carries a salary of \$16,000 a year.

Dr. Rice was recently under contract with the Agency for International Development as Research Adviser for the Central Bank of Nigeria, a post he assumed in November 1962. Before that he served for two years as an Economist with the Federal Reserve Bank of New York and six years as Assistant Professor of Economics at Cornell University in Ithaca, New York.

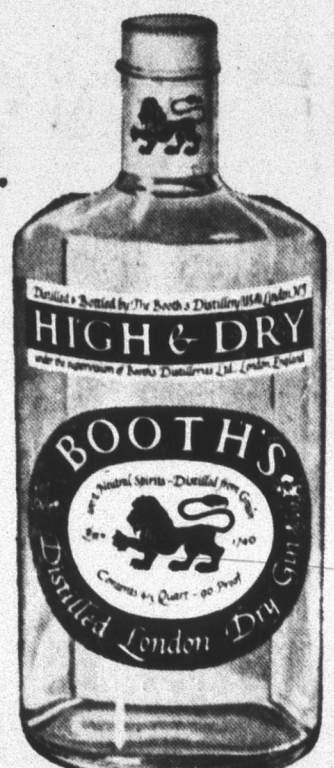
