## Mrs. Young Writes Of Mom's Role

NEW YORK, N. Y.—An article on the role of a Negro mother will appear in the July issue of Parents magazine on newstands Friday, June 26th.

The article written by Mrs. Whitney M. Young, Jr., wife of the executive director of the National Urban League, is entitled, "A Negro Mother Speaks of her Challenging Role in a Changing World."

"The role of a Negro mother during this period of racial unrest is an exciting, though burdensome one. It is a crucial role and one which I am proud to play at this

historic moment," Mrs. Young declares.

"The responsibility of the Negro mother has never been without its challenges, pain and heartbreaks; for added to the usual problems of raising a child is the Negro child's dilemma about his identity and the parents' frustrations in trying to insulate the child from hurt and embarrassment," she said.

Mrs. Young, the former Miss Margaret Buckner, and her husband have two daughters, Marcia, age 17, and Lauren, age 10.

Mrs. Young, who holds a master's degree in education, is active in the civic life of New Rochelle and in the PTA and other groups.

Her story declares that the role of the Negro mother is vital if the nation is to achieve its true greatness.
