 The merchants, along with buyers and sellers in this area, are expecting one of their most prosperous years in business.
 Dunn has long been one of the most attractive places for marketing tobacco and sellers and buyers have come from across the state and many areas to participate in the many sales.
 All conveniences await those who come to market their wares and trade in Dunn. Everyone is urged to take advantage of Dunn's hospitality. Again the merchants welcome you!
 The Dunn Tobacco Market opens

Thursday, August 27. From annual sales of 5 million pounds to annual sales averaging 12 million pounds in 2 years time. That's the story of the Dunn Tobacco Market.
 Dunn warehouses, are ready this year as never before for the tobacco market opening. Like other eastern North Carolina belt markets the market here will sell both tied and untied tobacco on the market for the first seven days and then will revert back to only tied tobacco.
 A full set of buyers will be on hand when the market opens. Dunn has more buying companies purchasing wares on the market here than almost any other market in the east. The Big Four Warehouse will be operated by Norman Hardee, Jack Calhoun and Tom Smith. The Big Four is located at the north of Dunn.
 The Planters Warehouse at the south end of town will be operated by Leland Lee and J. M. Smothers. The Dunn market sells 2,500 baskets a day, with each of the 3 warehouses having an equal number of baskets to sell.
 John G. Thomas will be supervisor of the market again. Two large warehouses here gives the farmers plenty of space to sell their tobacco.
 Since 1958, the Dunn market has had the largest number of buyers of any one set tobacco market in the whole wide world. Each bidding against the other to assure the farmer the top dollar for his entire crop.

DBC Receives Recognition
 DURHAM—Foreign students will become a part of the student body of Durham Business College during the 1958-59 school term for the first time in the institution's 18 year history. As a result of the College's approval by the U. S. Immigration Service, Durham Business College has joined the ranks of the selected few. Although the great majority of the state senior colleges have such approval, relatively few in the south have qualified for the training of non-immigrant foreign students. Presently 6 foreign students from Lagos, Nigeria will enroll for the fall term and three more have completed preliminary requirements in the Winter Quarter which starts in December. According to U. S. Immigration regulations, foreign persons may come into the U. S. for educational purposes without regard to immigration quotas but are restricted in their access to only those institutions that


