Saint Monica's Invites All To Open House Here Sun.

Saint Monica's Catholic Church will hold an Open House on Sunday, August 30th. The church, school, rectory and convent will be open for inspection by the public from eleven o'clock in the morning until one-thirty in the afternoon, and again from three-thirty until six in the afternoon. The congregations of all churches in Raleigh have been invited by a letter to their respective pastors. The vestments and vessels used by the priest at Mass, and other appointments used in Catholic worship will be

displayed and explained to all. The open house is being held in observance of the 54th anniversary of the parish. The parish was founded on September 7, 1910, by Bishop William J. Hefey, D. D. then bishop of Raleigh. Hefey founded the parish to care for the Negro people of Raleigh, and the counties of Franklin and Wake and part of Johnston County. At the time of the foundation there were no Negro Catholics in this area and the first admini-

stration of the Sacrament of Baptism was on Dec. 8, 1910, by the first pastor, Rev. Charles F. Hamigan, S. S. J. Church services were conducted in the parish school, which was erected as the first parish building, until 1947 when a Quonset type structure with a brick facade was erected to serve as a temporary church. The parish now numbers three hundred souls, about two thirds of whom are children or teen-agers. The parish has always greatly depended on the parochial school, both for the religious education of its own members and for attracting new members to its communion. The school has been run by the Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary Order, with headquarters in Scranton, Pa. The Dominican Fathers who have served the pastoral function in the parish for the last thirty years, members of a worldwide organi-

zation that has flourished in the Catholic Church for over seven hundred years. They exist separate from the immediate jurisdiction of any bishop so that they may engage in the multiple activities for the defense and spreading of the Catholic Faith. The official title of this free-swinging group of Catholic Priests is the Order of Preachers, a name derived from the principal work performed at its inception. The popular name for the order is the Dominican Order, because of its being founded by St. Dominic. Several of the Dominican priests who have served the church of St. Monica have been well known throughout the city of Raleigh and many other areas of the state of North Carolina. Fr. Orville Carl, Fr. John S. Dillon, and Fr. Walter J. Tierney won popular acceptance by the conducting of a band, by playing a top-seeded Father Edward J. Ferrick who was transferred from St. Monica's recently is now assigned to the mission territory of Peru in South America. The individual priests come and go but the Dominican Fathers continue the care of the spiritual flock committed to their care. The parishioners of St. Monica's are looking forward to a large turnout of old friends and new for their open house celebration.

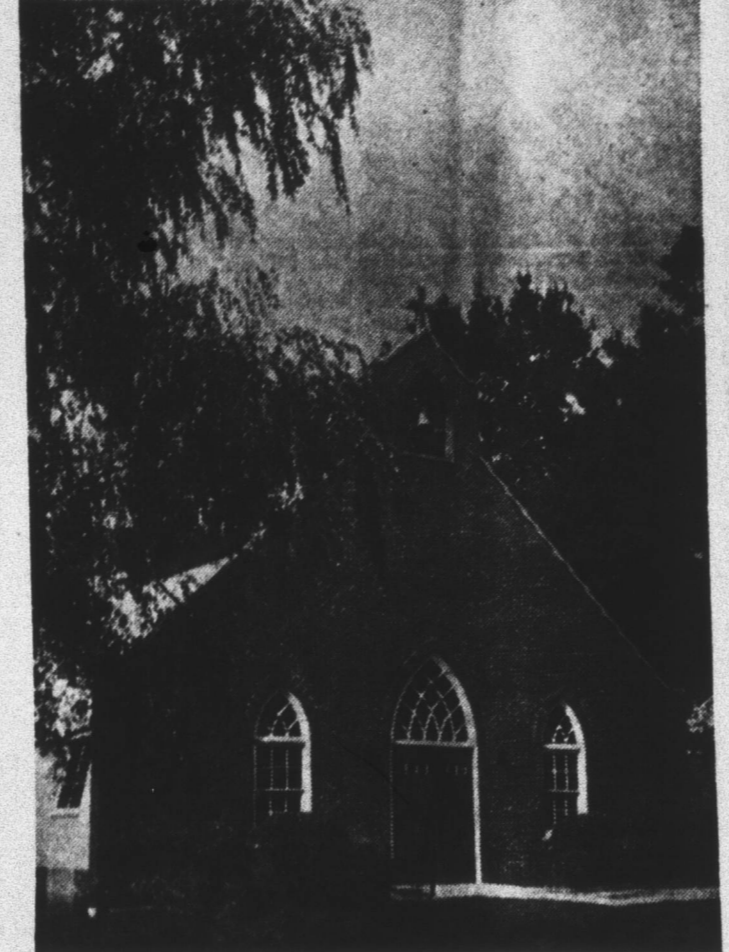

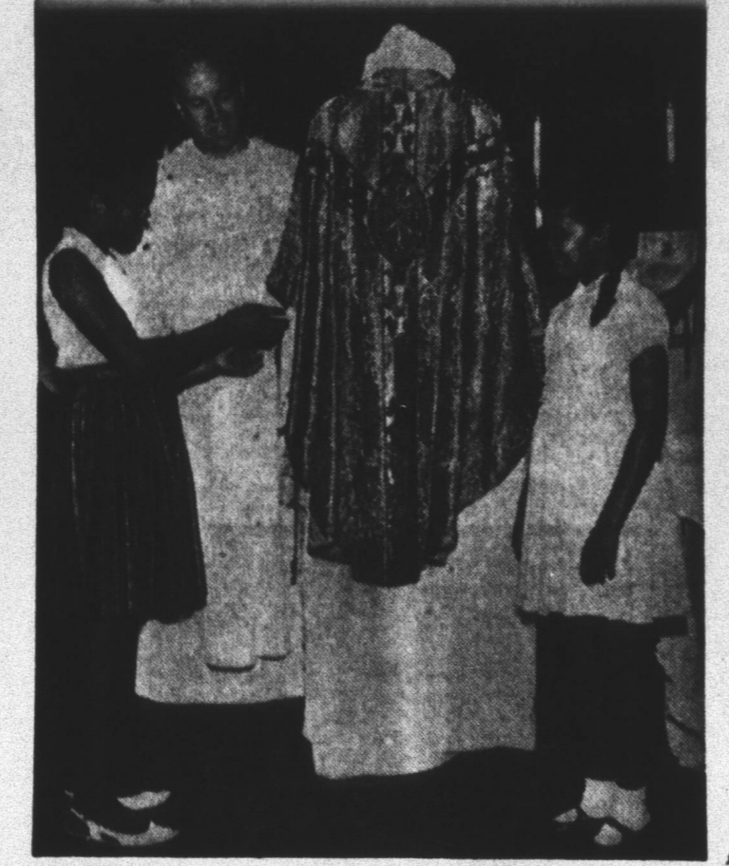
