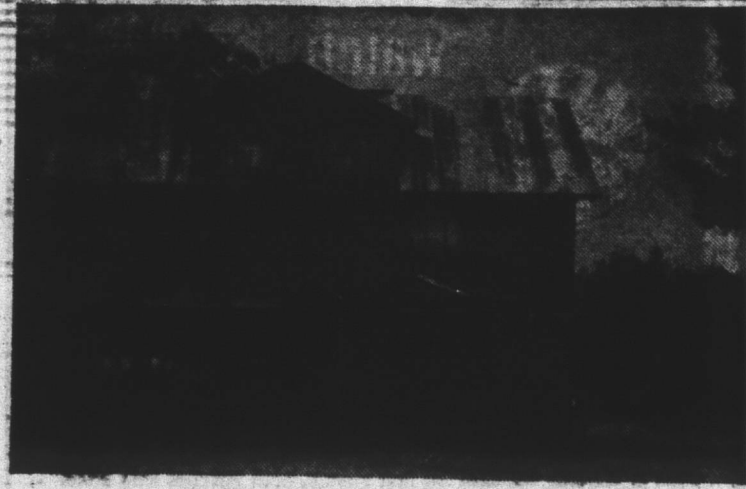
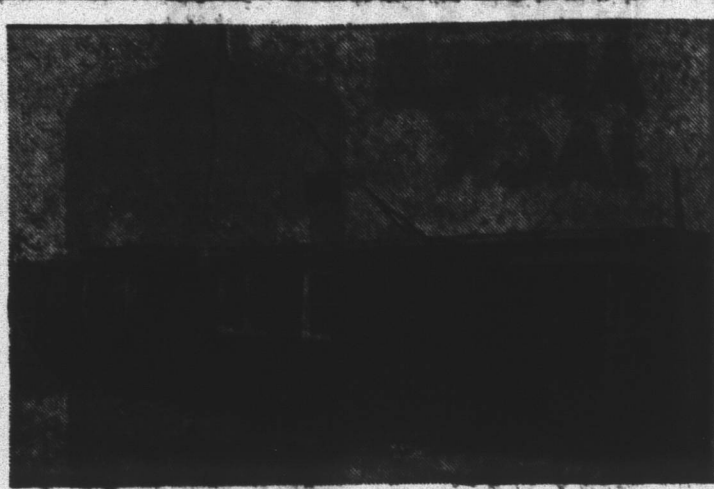


# A SALUTE TO GRANVILLE COUNTY CITIZENS FROM THE MERCHANTS BELOW

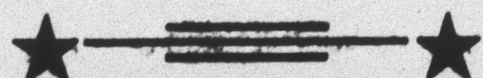

## Granville County 4-H Club Council Ends Clothing Show

OXFORD—The Granville County 4-H Club Council staged a clothing exhibit at the N. C. State Fair and won a meritorious award recently.

Miss Delois Woodard, a 4-H'er of the Butner Community, Granville County's winner in the state sewing demonstration; and Miss Frances Green, a 4-H'er of the Creedmoor Community, a district dress revue participant, exhibited dresses and gave demonstrations in the Fair booth on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

The name of the exhibit was "4-H'ers Learn To Sew and Save" at which time school and dressy

dresses were displayed. The prices of the school dresses, including fabric, thread, zippers, and interfacing were \$1.68, \$1.74 and \$1.91; and the dressy dress was \$4.16. All dresses which were made from one pattern, were constructed from washable durable fabrics. The essential sewing tools were exhibited on a pegboard in the booth.

The demonstrators showed how to mark darts, do directional stitching, directional pressing over the ham or press cushion; how to make bias loops and facings for trimming with the use of the bodkin, and the use of the essential sewing tools.

Miss Woodard is a senior and Miss Green is a junior at the Hawley High School.

Morris, extension poultry specialist, State College. These ten 4-H Club chain members exemplified good feeding and management practices, which resulted in very good quality birds.

Red ribbon winners were: Kenneth E. Daniels of Route 1, Creedmoor; and Charlie Fields, Jr. of Route 1, Oxford. Blue ribbon winners received \$8.00 cash; red ribbon winner received \$6.00 cash. Ribbon and cash awards were provided through the courtesy of the Sears-Roebuck Foundation. Joe Cutts, of Oxford, auctioned off the birds.
