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The Veteran's Corner

EDITOR'S NOTE: Below are authoritative answers by the Veterans Administration to some of the many current questions from former servicemen and their families. Further information on veterans benefits may be obtained at any VA office.

Q—I will retire from military service after the deadline for schooling under the G. I. Bill expires on January 31, 1965. I have some service-incurred disabilities. What is the deadline for vocational rehabilitation training for veterans with qualifying vocational handicaps?

A—If you qualify, you would have nine years after your release from active duty to complete your

training.
Q—I have just received my National Service Life Insurance policy and it appears I should consider converting my term policy to one having a stable premium rate. Where can I get information?

A—Information is available from any regional office of the Veterans Administration. Or you may write the office to which you make your insurance premium payments.

A—I understand that a disabled veteran has preference in employment by the Federal Government and many states and cities. How do I go about establishing this preference?

A—If you were retired for dis-

ability by the Armed Forces, your Service can furnish you proof. If you have established your disability as service-connected with the VA, the Regional Office which has your records can furnish you the appropriate certification.
