Q-I will retire from military service after the deadline for schooling under the G. I. Bill expires on January 31, 1965 I have some service incurred disabilities. What is the deadline for vocational rehabilita-tion training for veterans with qualifying vocational handi-

A-If you qualify, you would have nine years after your release from active duty to complete your

Q—I have just received my National Service Life Insur-ance policy and it appears I should consider converting my term policy to one having a stable premium rate Where can I get information?

A-Information is available from any regional office of the Veterar Administration. Or you may write the office to which you make your insurance premium payments.

A—I understand that a disabled veteran has preference in employment by the Federal Government and many states and cities. How do I go about establishing this preference?
