## Elizabeth City Head Is Honored

GREENVILLE — At the closing session of the 4th annual celebration of the North Carolina Joint Council of Health and Citizenship, recently at the C. M. Epps High School, Greenville, Dr. Walter H. Ridley was the recipient of the Citizenship Award presented by the Council "for foresighted leadership in education, community service and human rights."

This was the second time the award was presented. The Honorable Governor Terry Sanford received the award presented for the first time last year.

The presentation of the plaque to Dr. Ridley was made by the Honorable Herbert C. Bonner, Congressman, First District, North Carolina, upon the invitation of Mr. F. H. Mebane, the Principal of the E. B. Sugg High School, Farmville. Mr. Mebane introduced Dr. Ridley and spoke of his "insatiable drive to be of service to mankind." He traced his progress "as he works for the eradication of ignorance and functional illiteracy."

The keynote speaker was the Honorable Philip H. Des Marais, U. S. Deputy Assistant of Health, Education and Welfare.

The citation commending Dr. Ridley, stated in part — "He directed the growth and development of Elizabeth City State College from an enrollment of 320 to one of more than 1,000.

As Chairman of the Council's Board of Higher Education his far-sighted and cooperative spirit was used in pioneering the educational program of the organization. Nearly 200 teachers have been certified in the area of health and co-realtive education.

His conduct in the field of Human Rights has been consistent with reason and progress. He recognizes the spirit of brotherhood as funda-

post-graduate students working toward doctoral degrees. Candidates for the grants must have at least one year of teaching experience in member institutions.

The faculty fellowship program, begun in 1959 with a grant of \$300,000 from the General Education Board, is a means of improving the quality of instruction in the Fund's member institutions.

According to Mrs. Poitiers, "There are no plans for any divorce, but we have agreed to a separation and will try to see how it works out."

Poitiers, however, was in Japan for an appearance at the opening of "Elites of the Field," the picture which won for him the Academy Award; and thus was unavailable for comment.

The Poitiers have been having marital difficulties for the last few years. There had been rumors of a

romance and possible marriage between the actor and Elizabeth Taylor, popular songstress-actress.

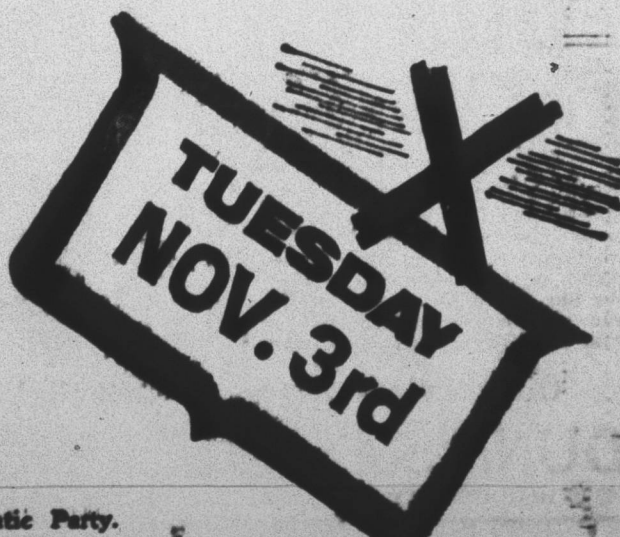
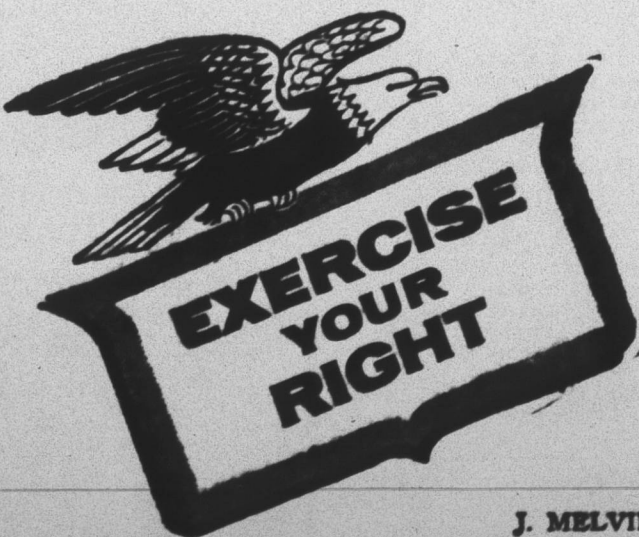
