Presbyterian Men Planning Meet Dec. 6

LUMBERTON — The annual meeting of the Cape Fear Council of United Presbyterian Men will be held Sunday, December 6th, at the Bethany United Presbyterian Church, Lumberton.

The theme of this meeting will be, "Sent into the world." This is the theme used by the National Council of United Presbyterian Men in the 1964 Area Meeting. Group discussions will be conducted with ministers and laymen serving as discussion leaders.

Speaker for this meeting will be the Reverend Robert J. Stone, Associate Director of the Commission on Religion and Race, The United Presbyterian Church in the United States of America. Until recently, he was pastor of the Adams-Parkhurst Presbyterian in New York City. At various times he has served as vice-president, Bronx Branch of the NAACP, member of the Bronx Board of Managers of the Urban League, and chairman of his local community council.

In the summer of 1961, he joined with a number of Rabbis and other ministers on a "freedom ride" from Washington, D. C. to Tallahassee, Florida, to test interstate travel facilities. Their case, following arrest in Florida, is now before the United States Supreme Court.
