C.—near Greenville. Brother Wichard was born May 1783, and was received a member of the church at Great Swamp February, 1821, and was chosen deacon April, 1826, and filled that important office up to the time of his death, and his vacancy has been filled by a very worthy brother—his son, John Wichard. Brother Hardy Wichard adorned his profession by a well-ordered life and Godly conversation. He delighted in the doctrine of the Primitive Baptists, which is salvation by grace through the merits of Christ.
