NEW YORK, Dec 4.—The Brooklyn Presbytery last night decided in favor of revision of the Confession of Faith, and their views are embodied in this declaration, which was adopted: That there are in the confession some statements of doctrines which can be, and ought to be, amended and improved so as to bring them more in to harmony with the teaching of the Scriptures, and with the present faith of the Presbyterian Church; and, furthermore, that there are in the confession some statements which, being without warrant of Scripture and not essential to the integrity of its system of doctrine, ought to be entirely omitted.—*Messenger*.
