Senator Morgan, of Ala has accepted an invitation to head the party of distinguished democratic speakers who are to be sent upon a missionary tour of the West and Northwest by the Nation al Association of Democratic clubs, similar to that sent out by the same association four years ago, which was so successful in arousing the interest of democrats in club work, which proved a consid erable factor in the democrat ic victory of '92. The party will seave Washington about Aug. 24th, going via Buffalo, through New York, thro' the Great Lakes to Duluth, Minnesota, where the firs meeting is to be held. The route from there will be thro' the Dakotas into Montana. thro' the Yellowstone Park, Idaho and Washington, the schedule being so arranged that the party can take part in the annual meeting of the Democratic Society in Washington. They will then go through Oregon, and Utah and continue as far west as San Francisco. The home ward bound trip will take in New Mexico, Nevada, Colorado, Nebraska, and Missouri. The party expects to be on the road about six weeks.

These missionary tours under the auspices of the associ ation of democratic clubs are not in the interest of any individual, but solely of the party. In fact, the associa tion of democratic clubs would find it impossible to boom any individual, as by its constitution it only meets one in every four years and then always after the party has made its presidential nomination. It booms the party and not the man.


