

and within a few miles of the site. It will be 1,600 teet feet long in the main spans of arch, which, it is claimed, is 20 feet longer than the longest arch in the world.

the channel spans 105 feet in Wilkesboro, N. C., on Wedabove the water, making it a decidedly imposing structure. It is to be a solid marble bridge from side to side, with a 50 foot roadway 100 feet above water, with the four largest spans in the world. The immense arches will be 8 feet deep at the key stone. 15 feet at the skewbacks or spring lines, and will spring from piers 80 feet high and 40 feet wide. The piers go to solid rock, the substructure limestone, 12 feet below the water surface at the bridge site. Thearch es and spandrel filling will be constructed of concrete.






