**Outside Interference Not Desired;**

The Winston Republican does not like the suggestion that the President is to dictate the policy of the Republican party in North Carolina. It did not like the amendment and fought it, but now the Republican protests that the Northern Republicans should not try to control the action of that party in North Carolina. It says:

"But this amendment was framed by the people of North Carolina themselves—the nation had nothing to do with it—and whether constitutional or unconstitutional, law or no law—it means, if it means anything, that the negro is to be eliminated from politics at the present, and this implication is just as enforceable as that part which says that those who cannot read and write the constitution shall not be allowed to vote. Everybody knows that the law was framed for the purpose of eliminating the negro from politics and if the law is allowed to be enforced at all it will be enforced in toto. Certainly it is rather late for any Northern sentiment to dictate the Republican policy of the South. For thirty years the Southern republicans have been struggling to give the negro, as well as every other citizen, his constitutional rights, and it made no difference how severe the conflict or how hazardous the undertaking they received no assistance from the North, either in genuine sentiment or in substantial aid. Now since the national government has stood off and seen, without a protest, the Southern States one by one restrict the negro vote they can hardly be accredited with an over sense of justice for insisting and demanding that the local leader's fight for the negroes that are left and keep themselves at daggers point with the Democrats who are scrambling for what negro votes they can get. The Northern Republican is not as good a friend to the negro as the Southern Republican, for how much recognition has the North ever given the negro in office or anything else? But through the fight that the Southern Republicans have made for the negro and the recognition they have given them, the North has gotten the strength of almost the solid negro vote in the North. to prostitute the South for their gain? If there is a any truth in these reports it must be that this is as for as their virtue and sense of justice goes. Formerly the sentiment has been with them, 'settle your local affairs, these things must adjust themselves.' Such was the reply to French who was driven out of Wilmington and others who sought relief. Now our motto should be, if the government is to allow the letter and spirit of the national constitution to be violated by any sort of practices or state law, that no intermeddling of the Northern leaders be allowed, but that our local matters be adjusted by our local leaders. If the North wants to show the negro any special favor at this time in order to hold his vote in the North, let them give him what place and power they see fit in the North and let their local matters adjust themselves. The Republicans in North Carolina will attend to things here and at the same time they will continue to remain the best friend to the negro and will champion the cause of the most practical methods for equal rights to all and special privileges to none."
