AFTER RURAL SERVICE.

Saltbury Evening Post.
We are publishing an article published in the Rural Free Delivery News, published in Washington as the national organ of the Rural Letter Carriers' Association which should be read by every farmer in Rowan county, as well as every man living in the country in America. The paper is nonpartisan, and the article speaks the facts just as they are in reference to that all important service now given our citizens living in our rural districts. It does not require an intelligent person to comprehend the importance of the Postmaster General Hitchcock, but anyone can plainly see that they intend to abolish the present splendid rural system of training in this country, and give the farmers the old unsatisfactory star-route system discarded by all governments. The only reason that this change has not been made, is that they are waiting until after the coming election to inaugurate the change. The monstrosity of this proposed change on the part of our Republican President and Attorney General, is that the change is based on the idea of economy. To our minds this is nothing more or less than a colossal joke. The idea of the Republican party and the extravagance of its billion dollar Congress talking about economy at the expense of the farmer of this country! We want every farmer in this country to know that there are hundreds of thousands of dollars appropriated every year by our Republican Congress, (and the same bills signed by President Taft) for the purpose of pneumatic letter tubes in the sky-scrapers of New York, Philadelphia, Boston and the other large cities of this country, and then for President Taft and Mr. Hitchcock to get worried about the insignificant extra expense of maintaining the Rural Free Delivery for the benefit of the farmers of this country is absurd. This system was first experimented with while Hon. John S. Henderson, of our city, was chairman of the House committee on Postoffices and Post Roads and the first actual test was made from the China Grove, N. C., post office, and it was largely through the efforts of Mr. Henderson, Hon. Kerr Craig, who has been third assistant Postmaster General of the United States, and Hon. Theo. F. Kluttz, as Congressman, that our splendid system is now in operation in this country. This blessing came through our own men, and it is one of the few direct acts of Congress peculiarly beneficial to the farmers of this country.

Is it possible that President Taft and the Republican Congress is going to deny the farmers (who so seldom receive any consideration at the hands of the Republican party) this most beneficial service given them by such men as Hon. Kerr Craig and Theo. F. Kluttz. It is another instance of their discrimination in favor of the rich and powerful cities, as against the farmers of America. could arise affecting the farmers of our country, and unless they see that Democrats are sent to the next Congress of the United States, this change according to all present indications will certainly be made. It is further evidence of the fact that the farmers of this country had better unite themselves against the Republican party and vote for all of the Democratic nominees, and cease affiliation with a party whose President, Attorney General and Congress are now studying means by which they are to destroy, for the sake of economy after spending over a billion at each Congress, this splendid system that is so much daily service to the farmers of the country. The following is the article: "The R. F. D. News, published at Washington as the national organ of the Rural Letter Carriers' Association, sounds an alarm in these terms: 'Right now preliminary plans are being made to abolish rural free delivery service and provide in its stead a daily delivery to the farmer by what is known as the star-route or contract system. This plan has been the subject of serious consideration by the Postmaster General for more than six or eight months past, and he hopes to be able to furnish President Taft with ample reasons for the change before the latter sends his annual message to Congress next December. It is the belief of many postal officials that President Taft will readily approve of the suggestion of the Postmaster General in the matter, and for the sake of economy, make a recommendation to Congress to enact the necessary law for the change. Already Postmaster General Hitchcock has consolidated the division of star-mail routes and division of rural free delivery into what will hereafter be known as the division of rural mails. This is the first step toward making the two services similar.'

The Farmers the Fore-runners of Political Insurgency.

In an article published in the Outlook last week Senator Dilliver, of Iowa, Insurgent Republican, discussed "The Forward (Insurgent) Movement in the Republican Party," and frankly states that the movement originated outside the party. The farmers of the West started it, he says, and continues:
"We are not yet up to the lessons with which these farmers of Iowa, Wisconsin, Minnesota and the states west of the Missouri made the period from 1870 to 1880 memorable in the annals of national life. In their time they were thought to be extremists and fanatics; yet the opinions which they espoused are now seen to be moderate and worthy of all acceptance."

But even more interesting than this statement, is Senator Dilliver's remarks about how the last tariff bill was made, the authors of which, he said, "had treated the Republican platform, defining the just measure of tariff rates, as a practical joke on the public."

But the public has called the joke, and everywhere either the Democrats or the Insurgents are smashing the old standpat Republican machine.
"No member of the Senate Finance committee," says Mr. Dilliver, "was able to stand up on the floor of the chamber and offer a reasonable explanation of any important details of the bill. Such members of the committee as designed to participate in the debate would have been absolutely helpless if they had mislaid the memoranda prepared for their use by persons who have not yet been elected to the Senate; although it is understood some of them are now candidates. No man can carefully read the hearings before the House committee on ways and means during the last twenty five years without seeing that the very language of our tariff laws, in all the more important schedules, including the punctuation, has been handed in to the committee of Congress by interested parties on the outside."

And after such testimony as that by such men as Senator Dilliver, a long-life Republican, the little old pre-empting Republican machine in North Carolina is "standing pat," and small-fry politicians who don't know any more about protection than a mud turtle, are going about telling the people that they need the old refuse that the balance of the country is casting off.

Democratic Prospects in the United States Senate.

The totally unexpected gain by the Democratic party of a Federal Senator in Maine has set persons to speculating upon the possibility of the control of the Senate of the Senate of the Sixty-second Congress by the Democratic party. The natural argument is that if the party can gain a Senator in Maine nothing is impossible.

The United States Senate, when all the 46 states are fully represented, consists of 92 Senators. In the present Congress 58 of these Senators are Republicans and 34 Democrats—a Republican majority of 24. In order to get control the Democrats must gain 13. On March 3 next the terms of 29 Senators will end. Of these 29 only 6 are Democrats, to wit: Talmadge of Florida, Rayner of Maryland, Money of Mississippi, Frazier of Tennessee, and Culbertson of Texas. Mr. Rayner has already been elected for the next term, and the other four Democrats will be succeeded by Democrats. The question to be considered is how many of the seats of 24 Republicans which will become vacant in March can the Democrats possibly win. They have already won one of the necessary 13—that of Maine. There is a strong probability of a Democratic gain in Connecticut, Delaware, Indiana, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Jersey, New York and Ohio. This would be a gain of ten, including Maine, and West Virginia and Wyoming as possibilities. Democrats from all these states would leave the Senate equally divided between the two parties, with a Republican Vice President to cast a vote in case of a tie.

The situation is exceedingly interesting. Whether the Democrats can control the Senate of the Sixty-second Congress or not, it is reasonably certain that the regular Republican organization will not control, for the insurgent Senators are more likely to vote with the Democrats on tariff and other important bills than with "stand patters."
