Returns of income for 1917 must be made between Jan. 1 and March 1, '18

"The Government recognizes, says Collector Watts, "that many persons experience a good deal of difficulty in filling out income tax forms. It recognizes. too, that taxpayers resident at points where collector's officers are not easily accessible find it hard to get proper instructions in the law. Next year, when every married person living with wife or husband and having a net income of \$2,000, and every unmarried person not the head of a family and having a net income of \$1,000 for the year 1917 hundreds in every commuity seeking light on the law, and help in executing their returns. This is decidedly in error. It is the other way round. The taxpayer has got to go to the Government and if he doesn't within the time prescribed, he is a violator of the law, and the government will go to him with its penalties."
