### Registration Books Will Open Today.

The books for the registration voters will open throughout the county and State today, and close on Saturday, October 3. The men, to be sure, will register, but the newly enfranchised ladies in this and every other county throughout the land would now awake to the duty that is incumbent upon them as result of the woman suffrage amendment to the Constitution of the United States and see that their names are properly recorded, so that they may be allowed their votes in the November election. The major part of the ladies of the South were opposed, beyond question, to woman suffrage, which was thrust upon them, but now, as patriotic citizens, it is their duty to register and vote for the men and women of their choice in the November election. Register, good women, and see that your neighbor women do likewise.

The school ball team went to Shulls Mills Saturday for a game, the score being 12 to 15 in favor of the Shulls Mills team. This is the second time our boys have been defeated by this team, but they are plucky, and say they will try them again.

The chapel exercises on Saturday took a most interesting and helpful turn when Prof. Miller made a brief talk about the societies of the young, and introduced several young men who spoke enthusiastically as to the society work, all urging the boys to a more hearty co-operation in the work of the societies. Much interest was manifested.

The recent census shows that Watauga county has lost 79 in population during the past ten years. It may be well to state that the loss is due to a larger part of two townships being cut off into Avery county, causing a loss of 1260. Taking this into consideration the actual gain in the county, as it now stands lacks only 19 of being 1200. Boone has gained a little more than 121 per cent, and taking in the contiguous population just outside the corporate limits it would reach close to 200 per cent, or more. We just want to keep things straight.
