The first frosts of the season came on Saturday and Sunday, but they were light enough not to injure vegetation. The contract for the water works for the school has been given to Charlotte contractors. The water is to be secured from springs on the side of Eich Mountain and the reservoir to be erected on the hill back of the Dougherty residence will have a capacity of 250,000 gallons.
