(It costs us \$120.00 a year to feed and educate a child) The total amount thus asked for wa-\$3,120.00 .Our good friends, to whom we are so grateful today, concribated not only this but \$1034.39 additional This is exactly \$45.61 short of ainmore subscriptions of \$120.00 each The significance in this figure nine the fact that only eighteen days from the time of the collection nine girls are to finish their time at the orphan age and come over to the school de partment for their ligh School in struction. This means that nine new children will be taken to fill the places thus left vacant, and that one year support for them is aready in eight

Surely this is the Lord caring for his children and his work. Too much cannot be said for the kindness of our good frends who worked this collection up.—Dr. C. G.
