E. D. COOK APPOINTED COUNTY FOREST WARDEN

Due to the cooperation of the County Commissioners and other citizens of Watauga County the District Forester has been able to procure E. D. Cook of Rutherford, N. C., as the County Forest Warden of Watauga County. Mr. Cook will have entire charge of the Forest Fire Prevention and Forest Fire Suppression work in the county. He will have a District Warden in each township, whose duty it will be to take charge of any forest fire which may occur in his district and to outen it at the least cost to the County and State. Publicity work such as cautioning people about fire and putting up posters will also be done by the Forest Wardens.

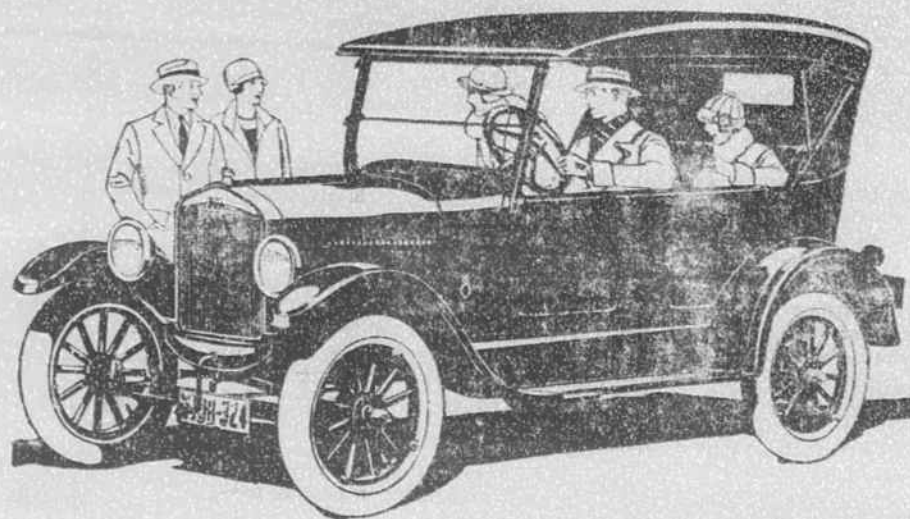

Division of Forestry, thru its representative District Forester H. M. Sebring of Lenoir, N. C. The success in protecting the timber wealth of the county depends not only upon the efficiency of the Forest Wardens, but also upon how the citizens of Watauga county cooperate with the wardens in preventing, locating and suppressing forest fires.

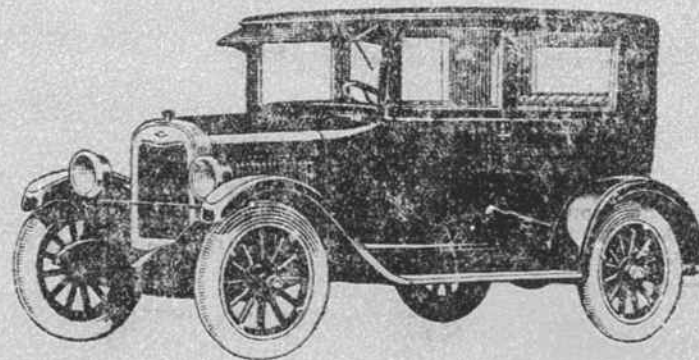
