

FIGHT ON RUM CAUSES ALL LIQUOR PERMITS REVOKED

Washington, Nov. 18.—Taking one of the most drastic steps since the reorganization of federal prohibition enforcement began last April, the treasury today revoked, effective on December 31, every outstanding alcohol permit issued under the federal prohibition law. Simultaneously, a sweeping investigation was begun to determine whether any or all of the permits should be renewed.

As an immediate result of these decisions, numerous court proceedings by permit holders were indicated. Announcement of the revocation order quickly spread among lawyers here who have devoted attention to prohibition questions, and some of them are understood to have advised their interested clients that injunction proceedings should be instituted immediately to compel its withdrawal.

The revocation was signed by Secretary Mellon and C. R. Nash acting commissioner of internal revenue. Unless court proceedings cause its reversal its effect will be to subject every holder of a permit to determine whether there have been violations of law which would preclude a reissue of the permit.

There were certain other features of the treasury ruling also which changed existing procedure, the decision reading:

"All basic permits issued under the titles two and three of the national prohibition act shall expire on them on December 31, 1925.
