Charlotte .--- The Democratic party maintained its overwhelming lead as late returns were assembled Satur day from the election.

Incomplete unofficial returns gave Frankin D. Roosevell a plocality of 250,000 in round numbers over Pres-ident Hoover, and similar majorities indicated for other Democratic cundidates. With 1,355 of the State's




