NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, that said Ordinance be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows: Section 1. Pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act of North Carolina as amended, bonds of the Town of Boone, North Carolina, are hereby authorized to be issued for the purpose of refunding valid bonded indebtedness of the Town of Boone, incurred prior to July 1, 1931, and which indebtedness is now due or payable within one year from the passage of this Ordinance...

Section 3. A tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds shall be annually levied and collected. Section 4. A statement of the debt of the municipality has been filed with the Clerk and is open to public inspection. Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and shall not be submitted to the voters.

The foregoing Ordinance was passed on the 10th day of February, 1933, and was first published on the 15th day of February, 1933.
