Jag Penn and Glenwood Greer were up from Globe for the week-end.

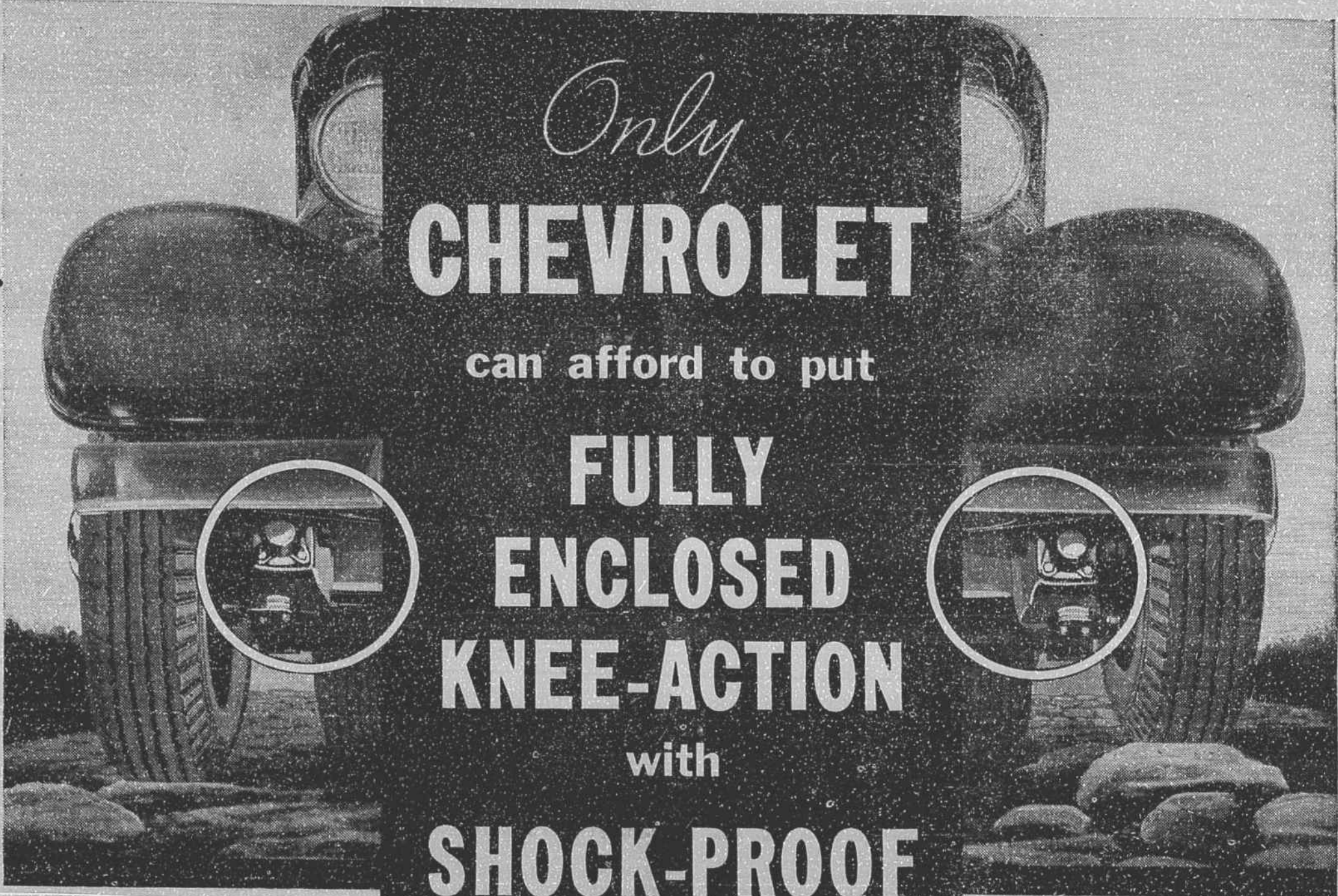
Mrs. Faye Warner is home from Mountain City for a short time, due to the illness of her sister, Mrs. Et-
