S. Carolina Governor Host To Boone People

Lutheran Group Signally Honored by Chief Executive on Visit to Columbia

Miss Cora Jefferson, together with Miss Blanche Townsend and Miss Dorothy Holt, Lutheran students of A. S. T. C., were among those who attended the southeastern regional convention of the Lutheran Students Association of America, which was held Friday, Saturday and Sunday in Columbia, S. C.

The Columbia State tells of the good fortune of the group in being personally welcomed to the state buildings by Governor Johnston. The report from this newspaper says:

"A group of students who are attending the southeastern regional convention of the Lutheran Students Association of America were 'in luck' yesterday afternoon when it came to having a 'real guide' to show them through the state capital.

"The delegates had visited a number of places of interest around the city and finally drifted down to the state house shortly after 5 o'clock yesterday afternoon. They found the front entrance to the building closed, but entered through a side door which they found open.

"In a few moments they had arrived in front of the governor's office and immediately wondered if Governor Johnston was still at his desk.

"They saw a man standing just inside the door and inquired as to whether Governor Johnston was in, and if he was in, could they meet him.

"'I am Governor Johnston,' the man they had questioned replied. 'Come right in.'

"The students explained who they were and immediately the governor appointed himself their guide through the stately and beautiful building.

"First he showed the party the pictures of former governors which hang in his office, and told them interesting stories of how some were elected and how some others were later defeated. Then he conducted them on a tour of the remainder of the building. The Confederate Relic room, the senate chamber, the hall of the house of representatives and other points of interest were pointed out and interesting anecdotes of past happenings were related to the visitors by their distinguished guide.

"When the tour through the building was completed the group was profuse in its thanks to Governor Johnston for his courtesy and as a parting gesture the governor invited them to come to the governor's mansion at 8:30 this morning so that he could again be their guide and show them through his home. His invitation was accepted with enthusiasm.

"Included in the group which met the governor were Miss Blanche Townsend of Boone, N. C., Miss Margaret Fry of Hagerstown, Md., Miss Barbara Moser of Burlington, N. C., Miss Dorothy Holt of Liberty, N. C., Miss Mary Lou Price of Winthrop college, Clements Hahn of Lenoir-Rhyne college, and Prof. H. A. Ahatt of Virginia Polytechnic institute."

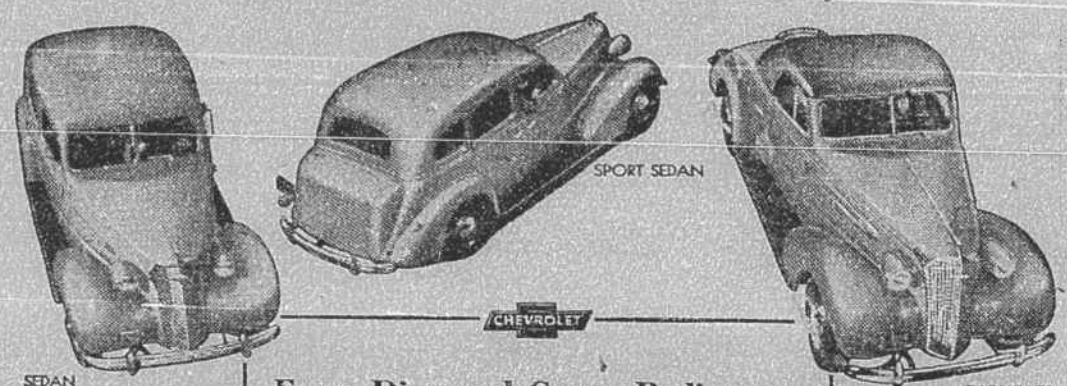

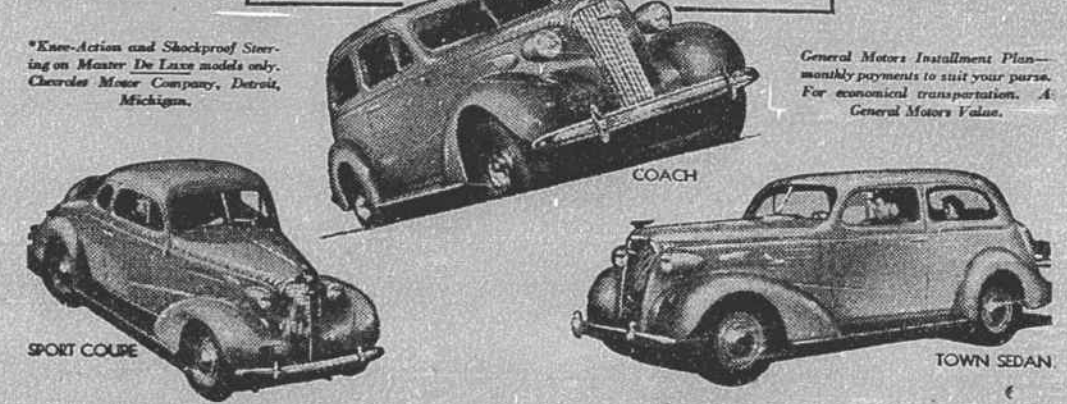

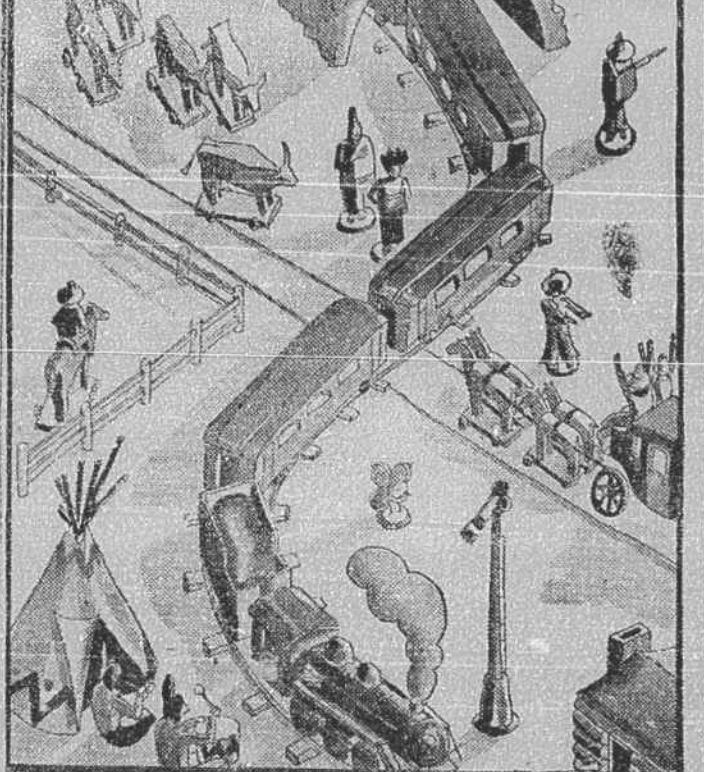
