Six-Inch Sermon

THE HOLY SPIRIT INSPIRES NEW TESTAMENT LETTERS

Lesson for July 27: Galatians 1:1-12; I Thessalonians 2:13; II Timothy 3:14-17; II Peter 3:14-6; Jude 3; Golden Text, II Timothy 3:16

In this lesson several passages are grouped in composite proof that the Holy Spirit inspired the writing of the New Testament letters.

Paul wrote the Galatians that what he had preached to them came to him through revelation of Jesus Christ. Writing the Thessalonians he thanked God they had received the message as the word of God. Paul urged Timothy to abide in the things he had learned from a child, as knowing that every scripture inspired of God is also profitable...

There is also a passage from Peter in which he writes of the "wisdom given" the "beloved brother Paul." Likewise an exhortation from Jude to contend earnestly for the faith which was once for all delivered unto the saints.

These several passages all lead to the same thought—that the Holy Spirit inspired the New Testament letters. Men, like ourselves, who were incapable of themselves to open the deep things of life, wrote as they were inspired by the Holy Spirit.

It is said the people were astonished at the teaching of Jesus for he taught them "as one having authority." In every field of knowledge we would hear a man who speaks with authority. So let us welcome the divine authority in the messages of the New Testament. That book is composed of the writings of those who were closely associated with Jesus and of those who had known those who knew Jesus—in short, of those who knew whereof they wrote. Let us be assured that we can come to the New Testament as to the revelation of God.

P.C.A. Loans Show Increase Past 6 Months

Farmers and stockmen in Watauga county have helped to increase the loan volume of the Winston-Salem Production Credit Association during the past six months of the year, according to Paul J. Vestal of Moravian Falls, who is president of the board of directors of this farmers' co-operative credit organization.

Reporting 136,944.20 loaned during the first six months of the year, Mr. Vestal said a good share of it went to finance seasonal operations of Watauga county farmers, stockmen and growers.

Reports from all over the nation, Mr. Vestal said, indicate that some time during the month of July some farmer or stockman somewhere in the United States will receive the two billion dollars to be loaned by a production credit association. This two billion dollars has been loaned to farmers on terms adapted to their

individual needs thereby providing a dependable source of credit at reasonable cost.

Since the Winston-Salem association began operations in 1934 it has loaned \$945,012.20 to finance the needs of the members in Alleghany, Ashe, Caldwell, Davidson, Forsyth, Stokes, Surry, Watauga, Wilkes and Yadkin counties.
