Here are a number of chemicals which may be added to shellac as a carrier. Small pieces of wood may be painted with the mixtures, or the chemicals and shellac mixed with sawdust.

- Violet flame potassium chlorate
- Yellow flame potassium nitrate
- Orange flame calcium chloride
- Red flame strontium nitrate
- Apple-green flame barium nitrate
- Emerald flame copper nitrate
- Green flame borax
- Purple flame lithium chloride

Funeral services for Roy Reece, 70, who died in a Bristol, Va., hospital on Tuesday, were conducted from Zionville church Friday afternoon by Rev. Mr. Whitson of Bristol, Va., and Rev. R. C. Eggers, of Zionville, with Cook Funeral Home in charge of arrangements. Burial was in Zionville cemetery.

Surviving Mr. Reece are his wife, Mrs. Belle Younce Reece, of Bristol; three sons, Burnam Reece, of Chuckey, Tenn.; Earl Reece, of Mountain City, Tenn.; and Lester Reece, of Bristol; four daughters, Mrs. Richard Patrick, Mrs. Charles Richards and Mary Reece of Bristol, and Mrs. Jack Walker of Chucky; also a sister and brother survive, who are Mrs. Ben Culler of Zionville, and Smith Reece of Chucky, Tenn.

Mr. Reece, who had been in poor health for several months, only became seriously ill on Monday when he was rushed to the hospital where he succumbed.

Mr. Reece was a native of Watauga county, where his friends will hear of his death with sorrow.
