It took 758,601.73 the House seven days and 36 1,182,416.02 ballots to settle on Jefferson. Vermont and Maryland finally 1,086,387.33 swung to him after being evenly divided and passing numerous 618,553.38 times.

The Farm Bureau is over a million and a quarter farm families, bound together for one common cause-to work for a fair share of the National Income for all farmers-Sharecroppers, tenants, and land-owners-all alike, operating in forty-five states on the combined judgment of farm people from the county to the state and on to the national office in Washington, D.
