(continued from page one) flung operations. The balance of the jobs at the Boone installation are filled by Watauga County people, some of whom have advanced to supervisory positions, Mr. Kane said. When the plant reaches full production, it will employ 450 persons in two shifts, he added.

The plant is equipped with a modern dispensary, with Dr. H. M. Wilson and Miss Josephine Greer, R. N., on regular duty two afternoons each week, and on call at all other times.

The spacious, well-equipped cafeteria, which was installed and completely facilitated by IRC, is staffed and operated by and for the sole benefit of the North Carolina Commission for the Blind, in cooperation with the Lions Clubs of the state.

Major crimes in this country increased 8.5 per cent in the first half of this year over the similar period of 1953, according to a report by F. B. I. Director J. Edgar Hoover. A major crime was committed every 13.8 seconds, and an average of thirty-five persons succumbed daily of felonious attacks.
