Watauga Shows More Sales Tax During Month

Sales tax collections for October in 47 North Carolina counties were greater than for the same month in 1953, according to State Revenue Department figures tabulated by the N. C. Merchants Association.

The counties showing increased retail business over October a year ago were: Alamance, Alleghany, Anson, Avery, Buncombe, Cabarrus, Caldwell, Camden, Caswell, Catawba, Cherokee, Clay, Currituck, Davie, Durham, Edgecombe, Forsyth, Franklin, Gates, Granville, Halifax, Haywood, Henderson, Hyde, Johnston, Lee, Lincoln, Macon, Madison, McDowell, Mecklenburg, Mitchell, Onslow, Person, Polk, Randolph, Richmond, Rockingham, Stokes, Surry, Transylvania, Vance, Warren, Washington, Watauga, and Yadkin.

Sales tax collections in the State for October were \$4,776,535.09 as compared with \$4,490,506.02 for September, an increase of more than six per cent.

Cities having sales tax collections in October over October of the

previous year were: Asheville, Charlotte, Concord, Durham, Henderson, Hickory, Reidsville, Rocky Mount, Salisbury, Sanford, and Winston-Salem.

Total collections for all areas in October were less than one per cent short of the 1953.

"All signs point to one of the best autumn seasons on record," said Thompson Greenwood, executive secretary of the merchants' organization.

FARM INCOME

Farmers in 1953 were able to retain after expenses, only 36.5 per cent of their gross income, according to the Agriculture Department. This was well below the average of the past forty years and the lowest level since 1932. Only recently, the Department predicted that farmers next year would "get moderately lower" prices than in 1954.
