**GI FARM LOANS**

A new law makes it easier for World War II and Korean conflict veterans to purchase farms on which there is a home, or to construct or improve farmhouses. The law increases the Veterans Administration guaranty of GI farm loans made by private lenders to 60 per cent of the loan, with a maximum guaranty of \$7,500. World War II veterans have until July 25, 1957 to use the GI loan benefits, while Korean conflict veterans have until January 31, 1965.

## Health Office Makes Report

The local health department reports that 297 persons received services during their regular Monday diagnostic and foodhandler clinic, July 11th.

Of these 297, 29 were given examinations for health certificates, 63 children received immunizations for whooping cough, diphtheria, and tetanus, 10 children received smallpox vaccinations, and 234 persons received typhoid immunizations.

Dr. Mary Michal, health officer, and Miss Hazel Holder, public health nurse, were assisted in the clinic by a volunteer nurse, Mrs. Lois Church.

In clinics held outside of the health department by health department personnel last week, which included a clinic at the Blowing Rock Hospital and one at Bethel School, 10 foodhandlers received examinations and immunizations for health certificates, 11 children were given immunizations for whooping cough, diphtheria, tetanus, and smallpox, 60 individuals were immunized for tetanus and approximately 50 people were given typhoid immunization boosters.

In addition to the above clinics members of the National Guard were given 39 typhoid injections during the past week.
