GI FARM LOANS

A new law makes it easier for World War II and Korean conflict veterans to purchase farms on which there is a home, or to con-struct or improve farmhouses. The law increases the Veterans Administration guaranty of GI farm loans made by private lenders to 60 per cent of the loan, with a maximum guaranty of \$7,500. World War II veterans have until July 25, 1957 to use the GI loan benefits, while Korean conflict veterans have until January 31,
