The average wage scales for union construction workers rose 6 cents an hour during the three-month period ended July 1, according to the Labor Department. For the year ended July 1, the average increase was 9 cents an hour. The latest average rate for brick-layers, according to the report, is \$4.47 an hour; carpenters, \$3.01; electricians, \$3.17; painters, \$2.87; plasterers, \$3.36; plumbers, \$3.19; and laborers, \$2.04.
