Question: How valuable is winter crover crop?

Answer: The ASC says that good legume cover crop turned under in the spring will yield an equivalent of 300 to 400 pounds of nitrogen fertilizer to the acre. The cover, when turned under, also provides a way to keep up the organic matter in the soil, in-crease the ability of the soil to soak up and hold moisture, and improve soil structure.


