Consumer prices age of .1 per cent February and mid-M advance since last 1

Defense Secretary Wilson ac nowledged at a news conference that the Soviet Union was out stripping this country in produc-tion of long-range bombers.

Consumer prices rose an average of i per cent between mid-February and mid-March—the first advance since last November. The index for March stood at 114.7, compared with the 1947-49 average of 100. This was 3 per cent higher than in March, 1955, and 12.7 per cent higher than the pre-Korean war level of June, 1950.
